**National Night Out Against Crime** – Hyrum will be hosting the annual National Night Out Against Crime on Tuesday, August 6<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 p.m. on the City Square in conjunction with many communities across Utah and the United States. National Night Out, a yearlong community building campaign, is designed to: 1) heighten crime prevention awareness, 2) generate support for, and participation in, local anticrime programs, 3) strengthen neighborhood spirit and police-community partnerships, and 4) send a message to criminals letting them know that neighborhoods are organized and fighting back.

## WATER-EFFICIENT LANDSCAPING

**UTAH CONSUMES**  
**240** gallons of water per person per day

**1.5x** more water is used on landscapes than indoors  
*(40% is used indoors and 60% is used outdoors)*

If you watered your lawn one day less each week, you could reduce your water consumption by **10-15%**

Utah's goal since 2000 is to reduce water consumption 25% by 2025  
**We are currently at 18%**

**The suggested amount of water to apply in Cache County is 1/2 inch each time you irrigate turfgrass.**

### Cache County RECOMMENDED IRRIGATION SCHEDULE

- Startup through April:** No irrigation (only in very dry years)
- May:** Once every 4 days
- June and July:** Once every 3 days
- August:** Once every 4 days
- September:** Once every 6 days
- October to shutdown:** Once every 12 days (only in very dry years)
