Start gathering things you want to dispose of during our annual Spring Cleanup. Dumpsters will be available for your use at East Park (700 East Main) on May 2nd & 3rd from 7:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m. and on May 4th from 7:00 a.m. until 12:00 noon. Proof of residency within Hyrum City limits will be required. Bring something to verify

your address. Remember please DO NOT discard these items in the dumpsters: tires, automotive batteries, motor oil, antifreeze, chemicals, ashes, fireworks, tv's and paint. Metal recycling bins will be available for any metal (aluminum, steel, etc.). Please remember that refrigerators will be accepted only if Freon is drained.

Curbside green waste cans will begin to be picked up weekly in April. Since Logan City discontinued the green waste bins that were at East Park, any green waste that will not fit in your garbage can will need to be hauled to Logan Landfill at 153 North 1400 West, Logan. They are open Monday – Saturday from 8:00 a.m. until 4:30 p.m. There is no cost.

Hyrum City code does not allow items to be stored on the city right of way for longer than 48 hours. We realize you may not be aware of this code. In an effort to bring residents into compliance, you may receive a letter letting you know that you have things that need to be moved off of the city right of way. Automated Messages - Residents will no longer be receiving recorded messages from Hyrum City unless it involves a utility problem, road closure, or an emergency in your neighborhood. We encourage those who have blocked the city's number to unblock it to receive calls in case of an emergency.

Those who like to be reminded of upcoming events can sign up for those reminders by returning a signed form, which is included with this newsletter or by stopping at the City Office, Library, Museum or Senior Center. Notifications for events will be sent out <u>only to those who</u> <u>sign up to receive them</u>, which will be through a different system than the emergency call out.

Indoor Walking – This is the last month the Elite Hall is open for free public walking every Monday – Friday from 7:00-10:00 a.m. All are welcome, but please supervise children and don't bring any food or drinks other than water.

Be Aware Of What Goes Down Your Drain - Hyrum City is asking everyone to be considerate of what is flushed down the toilet. Keep it simple, and stick to the three P's: Pee, Poop and Paper (toilet paper).

Last Year, the main sewer line was clogged with solids that do not belong in the system. Unfortunately, this caused sewage to back up in a few people's homes. Most of the larger solids that clogged the line were flushable wipes and feminine hygiene products, namely tampons. These items do not belong in the sewer system. Despite flushable wipes misleading name, they should not be flushed and have been the cause of many systems backups throughout the country.

So please, be aware of what goes down your drain. It cannot only plug off your lateral but can also cause sewage to backup in your neighbor's line downstream. Neither of which is covered by the City's insurance. We encourage each homeowner to work with your homeowner's insurance agent to make sure you have the coverage you need and want for sewer backups and floods. Hyrum City regularly cleans out the sewer lines to industry standards at the expense of over \$50,000 a year. If cleanings must be increased, it will come at a cost to taxpayers. Please educate the members of your household and let's prevent these types of issues.

Museum News - Did you know that first non-Indigenous people entered what came to be known as Cache Valley 200 years ago in 1824? Initially, Rocky Mountain Fur Company trappers including William Sublette and Jim Bridger translated the Shoshone Seuhubeogoi or "Willow River" into Willow Valley. However, as they began caching their furs throughout the valley, they began to call the area Cache Valley. We will be celebrating Jim Bridger's Bicentennial during our SUPER SATURDAY event on April 27th with demonstrations from contemporary mountain men and women along with a fur-tastic art activity! The museum will be open from 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. and everyone is welcome.

Come enjoy a fun art project to learn all about bunnies and other signs of spring's arrival throughout Cache Valley's history at our monthly Back in Time children's activity, "Hop to It!" on April 16th - 18th from 1:00 - 1:30 p.m. each day.
