



Blacksmith Fork Canyon which supplies less than one percent of the City's energy. We recently completed a gas generation plant that will help reduce the cost of purchasing when power is in high demand.

Our power is transmitted from a Rocky Mountain Power transmission line that runs along the east bench of the valley from Providence to Millville. If a fire is started within 2 miles of the line, Rocky Mountain has notified us that they will shut the transmission line down, leaving the valley without power until the fire is controlled. They feel it is not a question of "if" this will happen, but a question of "when". Think of what you might need to do to prepare.

The number one cause of power outages are tree branches that have grown around powerlines. We hire professional tree trimmers that are certified to work around the power lines, each year to cut the tree limbs back from the power lines. When planting trees, be aware of where the power lines are located and plant trees away from them. If they are under the power lines, trimmers will occasionally come to cut the limbs back. The other option is to have the tree removed. We love our trees and prefer to trim around the line rather than take out the tree.

**Tune In To Meetings –** Did you know you can tune to 94.9 FM KVWJ and listen to Hyrum City Council Meetings at 6:30 p.m. on the 1<sup>st</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> Thursdays of the month, and the Planning Commission Meetings at 6:30 p.m. on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Thursday of each month. This is a great way to stay informed on topics discussed at these meetings if you are unable to attend.

**Road Maintenance** - Bids for road resurfacing projects that will be taking place this fall have been awarded and will be beginning soon. This year road projects will be taking place on the following roads: Rosewood Drive, Glenwood Drive, Fernwood Drive and Canyon View Drive. Other streets that were rebuilt last spring & fall will also have a slurry seal applied. Residents directly affected by this road maintenance will receive safety & traffic information as well as closure dates as projects near beginning dates.



**Storm Water –** Just a reminder to residents to please do not place debris, construction materials, piles of dirt/soil, bark, gravel, etc. in the curb & gutter/park strip area of your property or along roadways & sidewalks. Doing so not only affects our storm drain system, but it also becomes a safety hazard by blocking views, travel lanes and sidewalks. If you need to temporarily store these types of items, please place them behind the sidewalk and out of the street right-of-way. Thanks for your cooperation.

**Water Meters –** Hyrum City requires that access to your water meter box be maintained by the homeowner. The meter box ring & cover should be accessible at all times. Please trim bushes, trees and grass that block the way or cover your meter. Also, make sure that no objects cover or block your meter such as: cars, trailers, garbage & recycling bins, construction supplies & equipment, or landscape bark, rocks or gravel. This allows Hyrum City when necessary to access your meter for maintenance, meter readings or emergency shutoffs due to broken pipes & leaks.

# Ordinance Highlight – <u>Business Licenses</u>

# 5.04.020 License-Required

It shall be a class B misdemeanor for any person to transact, engage in or carry on any business, trade, profession, calling or to operate a vending, pinball or coin-operated machine without first receiving the class or type of license required by the municipality. Any person(s) owning rental property(ies) in Hyrum City must obtain a Hyrum City Commercial Business License. If there is more than one owner, each owner shall be jointly liable to pay the business license fee and to ensure all contact information is listed on the business license application for each owner. Owners of more than one rental dwelling or unit are required to obtain only one business license from Hyrum City. (Prior code 9-112; Ord. 11-04)

# 5.04.200 Home Occupation

- Home occupation means an occupation performed wholly within a residence or the yard and accessory buildings being a part of such residence. Home occupations shall not change the character of the residence or the residential neighborhood. A business license is required for some home occupations. They shall be issued for a one-year period and are renewable. The City Council may review a license in reaction to neighbor's complaints and may revoke it if evidence warrants this action.
- 2. Two levels of home occupations exist. Both are required to maintain all of the standards of a home occupation business license. Because of the potential negative impact on a residential area, the following businesses are prohibited as home occupations: auto/RV repairs, salvage yards, major appliance repair, or service.
- 3. Level one applicants are in occupation categories that the City Council has determined have virtually no negative impact on residential neighborhoods and do not require a license. Occasional businesses operated by a minor are not required to obtain a business license.
- 4. All applicants whose home occupations receive commercial delivery service, has signage advertising the business, performs services in view or hearing of the public, or has customers coming to the residence, are considered level two home occupations and require a license. They also may be required to meet with the City Council and explain how their home occupation is in conformance with the home occupation standards. The City Council may attach limitations or conditions to their licenses.
- 5. Home occupation standards:
  - 1. The exterior of the home will not be modified in any way to accommodate the home occupation (i.e. loading ramps, loading doors, etc).
  - 2. The occupation will be conducted entirely within the house, yard, and existing outbuildings.
  - 3. The home occupation license covers only residents of the home.
  - 4. No outside storage of goods or materials is permitted.
  - 5. Pedestrian and vehicular traffic will not be in excess of that normally associated with a residential neighborhood.

- 6. One sign will be permitted on the property. It must meet the requirements of HCC 17.72.010 Name
- 7. The home occupation must be operated in full conformity with fire, health, building electrical, plumbing codes, and all State and City laws and ordinances.
- 8. No noise, odor, light, vibrations or dust in excess of that normally associated with a residential neighborhood shall pass beyond the premises.
- 9. State licenses will be required for professional Child Care. (Ord. 98-16)
- 6. The City Council may, at their discretion, waive certain of the above standards for the elderly or handicapped.
- 7. Total cost of code enforcement, including city staff, professional services, etc. will be paid by licensee. (Ord. 00-20; Ord. 98-07; 09-08; 09-12)
