**Indoor Walking -** As the weather turns colder, don't forget that the Elite Hall is open Monday - Friday from 7:00 - 10:00 a.m. for free public walking. All are welcome, but please supervise children and don't bring any food or drinks other than water.

**Parking Restrictions** - Parking is not allowed on city streets or within ten feet of roadway pavement in any municipal right-of-way, unless such vehicle is in a driveway approach or otherwise parked behind the curb where curb exists for a period longer than fifteen minutes when loading or unloading or delivering property between the hours of <u>11:00 p.m. to 8:00 a.m.</u> This law allows for snow removal and is in effect until April 1st, even when there is no snow.

**Tune In To Meetings** – Did you know you can tune to 94.9 FM KVWJ and listen to Hyrum City Council Meetings at 6:30 p.m. on the 1<sup>st</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> Thursdays of the month, and the Planning Commission Meetings at 6:30 p.m. on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Thursday of each month. This is a great way to stay informed on topics discussed at these meetings if you are unable to attend.

**Waste Management Rate Increase –** As of October 1, 2024, Waste Management has increased the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for our trash collection services for the Cache Waste Consortium. The CPI has increased by 5.1%, therefore garbage, recycling, and green waste collection rates have been increased accordingly to reflect the increase.

**Cleaning Sewer Lines –** Hyrum City has completed cleaning sewer collection lines for the year. The report we received indicated that there were signs of grease build up in some areas. This is a reminder to NEVER pour grease down drains or toilets. When grease is poured down the drain, it can solidify and stick to the sides of the line and may eventually cause a blockage. Blocked sewer lines can cause sewage to back up into homes which can be a costly mess for homeowners. Please dispose of fat, oil and grease properly. They do not belong in the drains.

# Ordinance Highlight - 12.04.020 Obstructions Prohibited (Sidewalks, parking, pubic streets)

It is unlawful for any person owning, occupying or having control of any premises to place, or permit to be placed upon or in the sidewalk, parking area, gutter or on the half of the street next to such premises:

- 1. Any broken ware, glass, filth, rubbish, sweepings, refuse matter, ice, snow, water, garbage, ashes, tin cans or other like substances;
- 2. Any wagons, lumber, wood boxes, fencing, building material, dead trees, tree stumps, merchandise or other thing which shall obstruct such public street, gutter, parking area or sidewalk, or any part thereof, or the passage over and upon the same, or any part thereof, except as expressly authorize by ordinance, without the permission of the governing body first had and obtained;
- 3. Any permanent or temporary structure, mechanism, device, vehicle, or other thing of any kind or character except trees planted pursuant to the provisions of applicable ordinances. (Prior code § 11-362)
