**Mayors Message** – As the weather warms up and we begin to water our lawns and gardens, we need to be conscientious and conservative with the amount of water we are using – both outside & inside our homes.

Water Resources encourages all Utahns and sectors to do their part to conserve Utah's most precious resource – water, by embracing a water-wise ethic to safeguard the future of Utah.

Recently, Governor Cox stated, "I ask Utahns to evaluate their water use and find ways to save not only because of current drought conditions but also because we live in one of the driest states in the nation." He went on to ask for Utahns to use water wisely year-round.

You can find water saving tips at [www.slowtheflow.org](http://www.slowtheflow.org). Some of those tips include: fixing leaks; running full loads (dishwashers & washing machines); turning off the water while brushing teeth, saving, soaping up, doing dishes or rinsing vegetables; reducing showers by at least one minute. On the website you can find out how to receive up to \$100 when you replace your old toilet with a WaterSense-labeled toilet. Toilets use more water than any other indoor fixture. Because toilets manufactured before 1994 use more gallons of water per flush, replacing them is an easy way to conserve water.

The Weekly Lawn Watering Guide is another tool found on [www.slowtheflow.org](http://www.slowtheflow.org) that recommends how many days per week to water, based on extensive research, specific plant needs and weather conditions in your county. Microclimates may require adjustments to your watering schedule. There is a link on the website where you can sign-up for a water check.

Watering correctly, helps avoid problems with pests, disease, and waste, saving you time & money. We estimate that Utah could save more than 20 billion gallons of water if everyone were to water according to the guide.

**Spring Clean-Up** - Dumpsters will be available for your use at East Park (700 East Main) April 30<sup>th</sup> – May 8<sup>th</sup>. Remember please **DO NOT** discard these items in the dumpsters: tires, automotive batteries, motor oil, antifreeze, chemicals, ashes, fireworks, and paint.

Metal recycling bins will be available for any metal (aluminum, steel, etc.). Please remember that refrigerators will be accepted only if Freon is drained. Junk cars will also be accepted during our spring cleanup. You must provide Hyrum City the title to the vehicle. If you have any questions or need assistance, please call the city office at 245-6033.

The following household hazardous waste items are FREE to dispose of at the Logan Landfill Hazardous Waste Facility 153 North 1400 West, Logan (Commercial Hazardous Waste is NOT accepted): Antifreeze, Batteries, Bleach, Computers & Computer Monitors, Fertilizers & Other Yard Chemicals, Gasoline & Unwanted Fuels, Household Cleaning Agents, Insecticides/Pesticides/Fungicides, Items That Contain Mercury, Motor Oil, Paint, Paint Thinner, Pool & Spa Chemicals, Propane Cylinders, CRT Televisions, Transmission Fluid, and any Product With The Words Caution/Warning/Or Danger On The Label. Tires can be disposed of from \$2-\$10 per tire depending on size.
