Mayors Message – Hyrum Justice Court serves as the judicial branch of the city. The court has jurisdiction over all infractions and misdemeanor C and B violations as well as small claims. The court serves within the boundaries of the city of Hyrum, Paradise, and the city recently signed into an interlocal agreement with Nibley and Mendon. Judge Paul Larsen has presided over the court since August 2012. Judge Larsen has a Juris Doctorate from Western States College of Law. Diane Woolstenhulme has served as the clerk of

the court since June 1999, dealing with the day to day aspects of the court. Hailey Housley serves as assistant court clerk working Tuesday evenings when court is in session. The court is open daily in the afternoons and court is in session on Tuesday evenings. The mission of the courts is to “provide an open, fair, efficient and independent system of the advancement of justice under the law,” a mission which our court staff works for hard to uphold.

Winter Parking Restrictions – Winter parking restrictions begin November 1st. Parking is not allowed on city streets or within ten feet of roadway pavement in any municipal right-of-way between the hours of 12:00 midnight and 8:00 a.m. unless such vehicle is in a driveway approach or otherwise parked behind the curb where curb exists. This law allows for snow removal and is in effect between November 1st and April 1st, even when there is no snow.

Election Day – The General Election will be held on Tuesday, November 5th 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. All voting take place in the Hyrum City Council Chambers 60 West Main (NOT the Hyrum Civic Center). Museum News – Did you know that the Hyrum City Museum actively collects the stories of all veterans in our community? Visit the museum and you'll learn about local heroes such as Clyde Yeates, a World War II veteran who survived being a prisoner of war in Germany for eight months. Yeates served as a navigator and radio engineer in the Air Force and after releasing bombs in a raid over Germany, Yeates's plane fell into an uncontrollable tail spin. Ten days later he awoke in a Saasburg Hospital. He did not know who pulled the rip cord that opened his parachute, but learned that a Frenchman saw him land and saved his life. After a recovery of sorts, Yeates was imprisoned and only weighed 90 pounds when Russians liberated the camp on April 22, 1945 and found Yeates. This Veterans Day, honor your loved one by adding his or her story to the museum's collection at our annual Veterans History Workshop on Saturday, November 9th. Drop in anytime during our normal operating hours---10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. ---so we can help you document your service! We can assist you in putting together a scrapbook page for our veterans' exhibit or even conduct a short interview/oral history. Please take the time to come down so we can help you preserve your story.
