Mayors Message – Construction on the first phase of the new city fire station has begun. It is being built on the north side of the current fire station on 100 West. The building will house the fire trucks and equipment. Next spring the old fire station will be demolished and the second phase of the fire station, the administrative building, will be built in its place. The administrative building will have offices and a conference room for meeting and trainings. Phase 3, which consists of sleeping quarters, has been designed but will not be built until the time comes that the city transitions from a volunteer fire department to a partial full-time fire department. We anticipate that transition will not happen for several more years. The need for a new station was being discussed when I was first elected to the city council 15 years ago. Since that time, money has been saved and we will be paying cash for the construction of the fire station facilities.



The Hyrum City Fire Department provides fire suppression not only within Hyrum City limits, but also primary response in Cache County Zone 8 (from Blacksmith Fork River Bridge in Nibley to 7400 South, as well as Blacksmith Fork Canyon to the Rich & Weber County lines) contracts with Nibley and Millville for primary alarm response.

Hyrum's Fire Department currently has 32 trained volunteer firefighters. I am grateful to them for their dedicated training, responding to calls day & night, and their involvement in our community.

Winter Parking Restrictions – Winter parking restriction begin November 1st. Parking is not allowed on city streets or within ten feet of roadway pavement in any municipal right-of-way between the hours of 12:00 midnight and 8:00 a.m. unless such vehicle is in a driveway approach or otherwise parked behind the curb where curb exists. This law allows for snow removal and is in effect between November 1st and April 1st, even when there is no snow.

Christmas Dinner, December 5th at 12:00 p.m. Please RSVP early. Cost is \$4. Yummy meal, fun program and raffles.

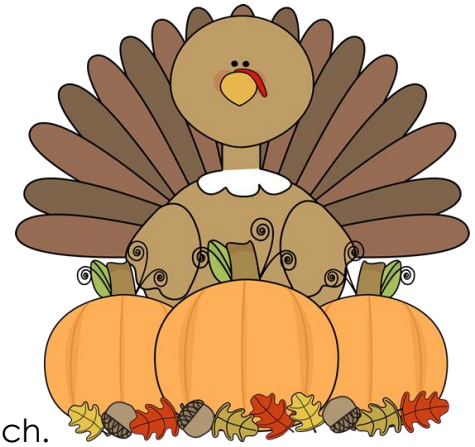
