City Council Meeting Summary – *Resolution 17-01 was passed authorizing Councilmember Jared Clawson to automatically succeed to the position of Mayor Pro Tempore.

*Resolution 17-02 was passed approving the application for Transportation and Utility Systems and Facilities on federal lands (Hyrum Feeder Canal Pumping Project).

*Resolution 17-03 was passed accepting a petition for annexation of 182.39 acres on the north side of Hwy. 101, behind Phillips 66 extending north to Johnson's Construction property.

*Ordinance 17-01 was passed amending the Hyrum City Municipal Code, to allow the Mayor and City Administrator ability to approve short term payment arrangements.

*Final plat approval was given for: Auburn Hills Subdivision located at approximately 600 South 800 East, Phase 1 consisting of 16 single family building lots; Elk Mountain Planned Unit Development located at approximately 1170 East 330 South, Phase 3 consisting of five single family building lots; Elk Mountain PUD located at approximately 1440 East 345 South, Phase 4 consisting of 16 single family building lots and 15 townhouses; Elk Mountain PUD located at approximately 1520 East 300 South, Phase 6 consisting of 12 single family building lots.

*Approval of appointments to the Museum Board were given for Chelsea Moultrie and Kathy Kingsbury.

*The 2017 Hyrum Youth Council was reviewed and approved.

The information for this city newsletter is required a month before it is printed. Therefore the March City Council Meeting hasn't taken place at the time this summary is composed.

Sump Pumps - During the recent flooding, it has come to our attention that many sump pumps are being discharged into the sewer system. This is not a legal discharge. This has pushed the sewer system beyond its designed capacity. By putting the discharge into the sewer system, it greatly increases the possibility for sewage to backup into your home or others around you. This also is resulting in major increases in costs to attempt to treat this water. The law requires that storm water be discharged onto the lawn area or onto the edge of the street. Because of the serious adverse impact this is having on the city sewer system this requirement is going to be strictly enforced. If you have any questions about what is required or allowed, please call the city office.

Sample numbers

Small 1/3 HP sump pump- pumps 2000 GPH

What if:

10 homes were pumping this amount= 20,000 GPH

20 homes were pumping this amount= 40,000 GPH

40 homes were pumping this amount= 80,000 GPH



The Hyrum Sewer Plant normally processes 40,000 GPH on an average day during the year.

Many sump pumps can move much more water than this example. Some homes have more than one pump running. You can see by these examples how discharging sumps into the sewer can overwhelm the ability of the plant to treat and manage the incoming flows.

Winter Parking Restrictions – Parking is not allowed on city streets or within ten feet of roadway pavement in any municipal right-of-way between the hours of 12:00 midnight and 8:00 a.m. unless such vehicle is in a driveway approach or otherwise parked behind the curb where curb exists. This law allows for snow removal and is in effect between November 1st and April 1st, even when there is no snow.

Election Notice – Notice is hereby given that Hyrum City will hold a Municipal Election this fall to elect one candidate to serve a four year term as Mayor of Hyrum City, and two candidates to serve four year terms on the Hyrum City Council. Persons desiring to be candidates for the 2017 Hyrum City Municipal Election must file a declaration of candidacy form or nomination petition between June 1, 2017 and June 7, 2017 at the City Recorder's Office, 60 West Main, Hyrum, Utah weekdays between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m.

Candidates must meet the following qualifications: 1. Be a United States citizen; 2. Be a registered voter of the City; 3. Be a resident of Hyrum City for at least 365 consecutive days immediately preceding the date of the election; and 4. Not be a convicted felon, unless their right to hold elective office has been restored.

The primary election, if necessary, will be held Tuesday, August 15, 2017 and the municipal election will be held Tuesday, November 7, 2017.

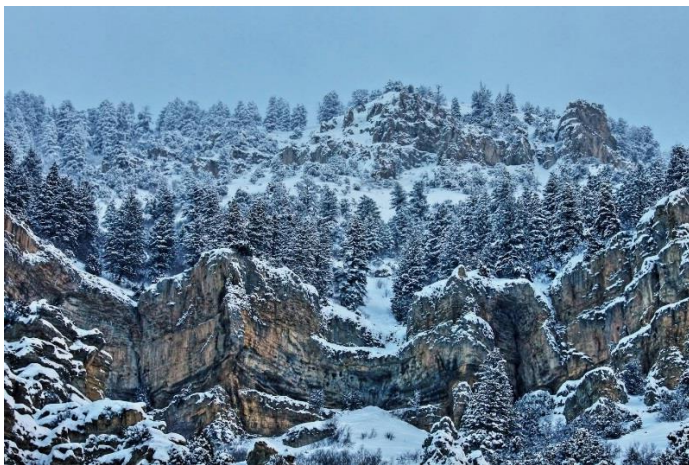
