December City Council Meeting Summary – A public hearing was held to receive public comment to consider potential projects for which funding may be applied under the CDBG Small Cities Program. Two applications were submitted. The Bear River Head Start program asked for \$30,000 for playground equipment for their playground area by Lincoln Elementary. The Wapiti subdivision asked for \$150,000 for utility upgrades in their subdivision. Most will be used to fix the sewer lines.

The council was presented and accepted the 2014-2015 Audit Report from Wiggins & Associates.

Final Plat approval was given for Phase III South Cache Subdivision at approximately 60 South 500 West.

Final Plat approval for Mountain View Estates was given contingent on an agreement with Elk Meadow development to allow further development of 1400 East. The subdivision is part of the Neighborhood nonprofit housing group.

The resolution setting dog license fees and late fees were approved. Spayed or neutered dogs are now \$12 to license, and \$22 for all others. Those registering after the last day of February will be charged a \$20 late fee.

A resolution was approved declaring certain Hyrum City equipment as surplus and ordering the sale of disposal thereof.

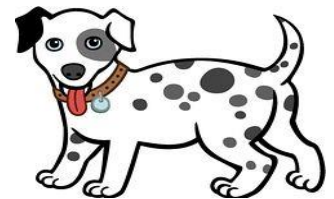
A resolution amending and readopting Hyrum City's General Plan was approved. It removes Multi-Family Housing infill in certain zones; updated statistical data to meet current census reports; updated information on businesses, park, committees and events; updated pictures.

An ordinance annexing 7.88 acres owned by JBS Swift into the corporate limits of Hyrum City was also approved.

The public is welcome to attend city council meetings on the first and third Thursday of each month at 6:30 p.m. in the City Council Chambers. An agenda for each meeting is posted on the city website www.hyrumcity.com The next scheduled meeting is on January 7th.

Business Licenses – All current business licenses need to be renewed. If renewal is not made by January 29th a late fee will be assessed. If you are starting a new business, please come into the Hyrum City Office and pick up an application. There is a \$10 application fee plus the following: home occupation business \$20; and commercial business \$75. Doing business without a business license is considered a Class B Misdemeanor. If you have any questions, please contact the city office.

Dog Licenses – Any dog(s) six (6) months or older is required to be licensed with Hyrum City. Dogs are required to be licensed even if they stay inside your home or never leave your yard. The license fees are as follows:



Neutered/Spayed dogs - \$12

Male/Female dogs - \$22

A veterinarian certificate is required to verify rabies vaccination and the dog being neutered or spayed. All dogs must be licensed by Monday, February 29th. After February 29th a \$20 late fee will be assessed in addition to the regular license fee. Owners will be issued a citation for failure to have his/her dog properly licensed. Also, please remember that City Ordinance permits a maximum of **two dogs per household**.

Winter Parking Restrictions – Parking is not allowed on city streets or within ten feet of roadway pavement in any municipal right-of-way between the hours of 12:00 midnight and 8:00 a.m. unless such vehicle is in a driveway approach or otherwise parked behind the curb where curb exists. This law allows for snow removal and is in effect between November 1st and April 1st, even when there is no snow.

Beginner ski and snowboard lessons are \$12 if you reserve and pay by noon on Monday, January 4th. Call 866-652-4324, ext. 1. It will be \$15 if you sign up for lessons on ski night.

Treecycling Program – This year's treecycling program will run from December 14th thru January 9th. Please be sure that your tree is free of lights, tinsel, ornaments and stands prior to dropping tree off at East Park (700 East Main). If you should miss the window for drop off, the green waste facility, located at the Logan Landfill is open year round. Please do not put trees at this drop site after January 9th.
