City Council Meeting Summary – The city council approved a resolution increasing library fees from \$30 to \$35 for nonresidents.

Also, approved was a resolution amending the building permit inspection and connection fee schedule which changes the deposit required for building a garage addition or other remodel from \$1,000 to \$500.

Martin Felix was appointed as Hyrum City's Intermountain Power Agency Representative. Angi Bair was also appointed to serve a five year term on the Planning Commission.

Winter Parking Restrictions – Parking is not allowed on city streets or within ten feet of roadway pavement in any municipal right-of-way between the hours of 12:00 midnight and 8:00 a.m. unless such vehicle is in a driveway approach or otherwise parked behind the curb where curb exists. This law allows for snow removal and is in effect between November 1st and April 1st, even when there is no snow.
