**Mayors Message** – A big issue currently being discussed at the State Capitol is the problem with Utah's transportation funding. Our traditional funding sources are no longer adequate. Utah's cities and counties are struggling to keep up with local transportation needs as our population is growing. We currently have only one-third to one-half the funds needed for transportation infrastructure. Because of more fuel efficient cars we collect less gas tax. Some transportation material costs have increased, by as much as 300 percent over the last decade. As Utah's population continues to grow, our infrastructure and transportation system has to keep up. There are many options being discussed to remedy the challenge we are facing. We will be following our legislature closely as this is being discussed. While the legislature is in session, there will be a public meeting with our local legislators on Saturday mornings at 7:30 in the county multipurpose room. You are welcome to come to hear the latest updates and ask any questions you might have.

**Winter Parking Restrictions** – Parking is not allowed on city streets or within ten feet of roadway pavement in any municipal right-of-way between the hours on 12:00 midnight and 8:00 a.m. unless such vehicle is in a driveway approach or otherwise parked behind the curb where curb exists. This law allows for snow removal and is in effect between November 1<sup>st</sup> and April 1<sup>st</sup>, even when there is no snow.

**Election Notice** – Notice is hereby given that Hyrum City will hold a Municipal Election this fall to elect three candidates to serve four year terms on the Hyrum City Council. Persons desiring to be candidates for the 2015 Hyrum City Municipal Election must file a declaration form or nomination petition between June 1, 2015 and June 8, 2015 at the City Recorder's Office, 83 West Main, Hyrum, Utah weekdays between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m.

Candidates must meet the following qualifications: 1. Be a United States citizen; 2. Be a registered voter of the City; 3. Be a resident of Hyrum City for at least 365 consecutive days immediately preceding the date of the election; and 4. Not be a convicted felon, unless their right to hold elective office has been restored.

The primary election, if necessary, will be held Tuesday, August 11, 2015 and the municipal election will be held Tuesday, November 3, 2015.

**Message from the Sewer Department** – The Hyrum City Sewer Department is recommending that as you begin cleaning up your yard this spring to locate your sewer cleanouts. (Usually a capped 4" pipe) It is a good idea to know where your cleanout is located, and to keep the surrounding area clear so that it can be accessed in a hurry. When a blockage does arise, quick access can be critical to prevent overflow.

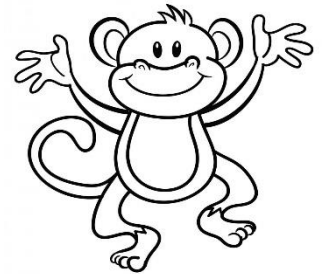
**HEAT Program** – The HEAT Program is a federally funded assistance program designed to help low-income, elderly and disabled households with home energy costs.

The HEAT Program is open November 1<sup>st</sup> through April 30<sup>th</sup> or until federal funds are exhausted.

Eligibility and benefit amounts are determined by number of U.S. residents or permanent residents in the household, household income, household size and energy costs (fuel and electric bills). Household must be under 150% of the Federal Poverty Level. HEAT benefits are a one-time payment and will not cover your entire heating costs.
