Election Notice - Hyrum City will be **canceling** its Municipal Election that was to be held on November 2, 2021. Pursuant to Utah Code 20A-1-206 since there are no municipal ballot propositions and all candidates are running uncontested for their respective offices including eligible write-in candidates (20A-9-601) the election will be cancelled. Each candidate is considered to be elected to the office for which they had filed for and will take office in January 2022.

Museum News – Did you know that there are SEVEN events and TEN exhibits within twenty miles of Hyrum during October for the H2O Today in the Bear River Heritage Area ongoing experience? And all of them are free! There are wonderful exhibits/art shows in addition to the Smithsonian exhibit "H2O Today" at the Hyrum City Museum such as ones at Cache Arts, the Artists' Gallery, USU Library, Newton Library, Brigham City Museum, Cache DUP Museum, Zootah, the American West Heritage Center, and Golden Spike National Historical Park (there is a fee to enter the grounds). There are also some really engaging events in October hosted by Brigham City Museums on the 7th, Cache Valley and Smithfield Historical Societies on the 9th, Helicon West on the 14th, American West Heritage Center on the 15-16th, Cache Arts on the 22nd, and Cache Community Connections on the 25th. The museum is open on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., Wednesdays and the 2nd Saturday of each month from 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., and by appointment. We are also on Facebook and Instagram.

The museum will be hosting tours of Hyrum's water treatment facility for our Second Saturday event on October 8th. Tours will leave from the museum at 11:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. We still have open slots for both times, so be sure to drop by, call, or email to sign-up. The museum will also be open so you can visit "H2O Today" from 10:00 a.m.-3:00 p.m.

Join us October 19-21 from 1:00-1:30 p.m. each day for our Back in Time children's activity, "A Sea of Tricks and Treats." Come in costume to dive a little deeper into our water exhibits as you trick or treat around the museum. We will also offer a virtual version the activity on Facebook Live on Thursday, October 21st at 11:30 a.m. for children unable to attend in person. All of the museum's activities are free and all children are welcome to participate.

Please note that all visitors to the museum and our programs are welcome to wear masks and hand sanitizer is available. Please postpone your visit if you are sick or not feeling well. Also, the museum will be closed the entire week of October 25-30 while museum staff attends annual professional development training.
